8. The members observed one minute's silence in memory of past member Ern Heinrich, who died on Sat 31st August.

11. Josie and Bronwyn have been checking out our club's website. Sorely in need of updating. Need someone to take over management of it.
12. Guest Speaker Helen Perry gave a power point presentation on her job as Record Manager for local government. Most councils have someone responsible for day to day record taking, but past records tend to collect dust in sheds and store rooms, and need to be sorted and compiled. She sometimes works in very rudimentary buildings e.g. old demountable classrooms. Some records can be destroyed, but many have to be kept forever. When the Auburn Cemetery was vandalised last year, Council had to try to trace family members to get permission to restore headstones. All descendants have since been found. Upper Wakefield Council (1854) had an assessment book from 1858 onwards. It lists all ratepayers and rate amounts paid. State Records Repository is a Cavan Road, Cavan. It has open days each week. The aim is to eventually digitise with overhead digital cameras to reduce handling. Helen said she has a very satisfying job, preserving information for future generations.
