Presidents Annual Report for 2022-2023

This year the Rotary Club of Clare has continued to serve our local, National and International Communities as it has done for many years.

This year's 2023 Rotary Club Art Show celebrated 25 years of Art Shows in the Clare Valley. It was a great event, beginning with our first-time Thursday Sponsor Night. The general public were very open with their compliments about all facets of the art show- a pleasing fact!

I must firstly thank all our many valued sponsors for their combined support both financially and with goods in-kind over many years. These include the Clare and Gilbert Valleys Council who deserve a special thanks for their help and support. I would also like to thank all the members of our local community who offered their help and time during the event as packers, organisers, hangers of art works and general helpers. It was appreciated and helped contribute to its overall success. I would also like to personally thank all of the club's membership for their efforts leading up to, during and after the show- You have helped build what is an important community event.

One of our previous events, the Local Contact, was discontinued this year and was a loss but our bi-monthly paper drives continue on with community support. The Heinrich family have continued their support of this enterprise as they have for over 30years. They store our paper until the containers fill up and then they transport them to the processing plant in Adelaide for us. This activity does help our environment and does contribute a few dollars to our club.

The Rotary Centre (the Shed) at Melrose Park has continued to be a real asset to our club. Unfortunately, the inverter for the rooftop solar panels broke down and will need replacing soon. Its use by one of the local probus clubs as their meeting venue has proven successful and has increased the use of the meeting room venue. I see the connection between our two clubs increasing over time.

Our wine sales have continued as a source of club funds, and although this year they are down a little, they remain an integral component to the financial support we offer to our communities.

During the 2022-23 year we have unfortunately lost 3 of our members who have moved from the district. This has resulted in an increased work load on other members and I know that the club is on a course to attract new members.

I would like to thank everyone who has supported me during my last 2 years of Presidency of this club, especially during those months when my health issues, and the results of the home fire incident were ever-present.

Finally, I would like to thank all members of this great club for their continued support at the Rotary events and functions as we now enter our 59th year as the Rotary Club of Clare.

This year saw our club continue to support our Bhutan project by financially supporting Dr Sonam Jamtscho to continue his final year of study and working in Queen Elizabeth Hospital to obtain his Fellowship in Reconstructive Plastic Surgery. He will be the first Reconstructive Plastic Surgeon in Bhutan.

With a very generous donation from one of our Rotary members and a matching amount from our Club we were able to pay for the flight to Australia for Dr Sonam and his wife plus assist with their living costs while they are in Adelaide till February 2024.

Rotary and Interplast {International Plastic Surgeons} work together in training Dr's, Nurses, Anaesthetists and other Allied Health professionals including Hand Therapists, to provide life changing surgery and medical training around the world.

Dr Sonam and Suzanne Caragianas, Hand Therapist who volunteers with Interplas, were presented with a surprise cheque for \$4000 at the opening of the Art Show thus promoting Rotary and our contribution, to all communities.

I hope our Club will continue to support Dr Sonam during his time in Adelaide.

The Sales this year to date are \$22,225.00.

Our costs including freight are \$15,469.00.

Our stocks are at Retail Value \$12,085.00

Normally at this time we would have ordered at least another two pallets of Shiraz and Riesling. Not so this year and the next vintage is on the way.
